

Australian Association Croquet Open Doubles

Ever wanted to play in a National Tournament? Grab a partner and enter the AC Open Doubles!

The annual Australian Association Croquet Open Doubles is being held at the Victorian Croquet Centre, Cairnlea; the largest croquet specific venue in the southern hemisphere.

The championship commences early on the morning of Saturday 19 November with the finals being played on Monday 21 November.

Doubles pairings from across Australia will test their skill and ability vying for the ACC Salvers. Last year's winners – Stephen Forster and Ian Dumergue – will be determined to keep the silverware in their trophy cabinets.

If you and your partner are wanting to 'have a go' but don't quite have the confidence to hit the 'big time' just yet, you can always enter the Plate event.

Please note that Atkins Quadway hoops will be used during this tournament (and the Open Singles).

Closing Date for Entries: Thursday 3 November (midnight WA time)

Entry Fees: \$80 per player or \$160 per pair

If entering the Plate ONLY: \$40 per player or \$80 per pair

Full time students (under 25) and players aged under 21 at December

2016 are entitled to 50% reduction of the above fees.

Functions: No formal functions have been arranged but there will be a presentation at

the conclusion of the final.

Prizes: The Winners receive \$300, a gold medal and the ACC Salvers each;

Runners Up receive \$150 each and a silver medal each.

Draw: To be conducted by the ACA Tournament Committee with help from

Events and AC Selection Committees using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures. The latest available world AC ranking list will be used for

seeding purposes.

Registration: From 2pm Friday 18 November.

Format: Format will depend on the actual numbers of entrants but the Doubles is

expected to be played as blocks initially and followed by knockout rounds with the best-of three or best-of-five games. The Doubles will be played

over 3 days.

Note – Players must be prepared to play at any reasonable time during daylight hours and may be required to play under lights. All games may be double banked except semi-finals and the final (if lawn availability allows).
