AGM Highlights

There was great attendance at the AGM from the associations with the exception of Marlbourgh, Taranaki (went home ill) and Wairarapa.

Too often there is an assumption that our membership knows about the contributions that the Executive and staff (Executive Director and Sport Development Officer) make. President Annie Henry spoke about the contributions that they made to croquet, giving the delegates more insights into the working of the Executive. She also thanked all of them. All reports were received, discussed and accepted. One announcement from the Tournament Committee was the naming of the GC 3rd Invitation. It is now called the **Geoff Young GC Invitation**.

The remits and recommendations were presented and voted on. The results are:

Remit 1: Increase the 2018 - 19 levies by \$3 for full members, new to croquet to \$23 and no change for 0 - 18 year olds at \$10. \$2 is earmarked for youth development. Carried.

Remit 2: The selectors will consider all nominations and select up to ten (10) players for the event from the advertised handicap range at the date of selection. Carried

Recommendation 1: CNZ will continue to provide Premier Silver Badges for AC level organised by regions. Carried.

Recommendation 2: Any Association that submits a recommendation to CNZ AGM to be considered by the Executive or a subcommittee will be notified: a) the result of the deliberations, and b) the reasons for the decision. Carried.

Recommendation 3: Withdrawn by Auckland.

All of the Executive stood down while elections were held. The Executive members elected were: President: D. Annie Henry

Councillors: Aaron Westerby (Auckland), Kareen McLaren (Thames Valley) and Tom Devlin (Canterbury)

The Executive will have the option to co-opt for vacancies on the Executive.

General Business:

- 1. Brian Boutel, Tournament Manager for World's AC Championships held in February 2018, gave an update. All is tracking well at this point.
- 2. Database there have been many problems with the database and ED Jake Inwood and Councillor Aaron Westerby are sorting them out. The aim is to have them fixed before the next season starts.
- 3. Potential problems with handicaps was raised. If there is a problem, <u>please contact the Laws</u> <u>Committee Convenor, Brian Boutel.</u>
- 4. There were some issues around communication with regards to the levies. Jake is sorting these out and levies will be clearly marked in the future.
- 5. An enquiry with regards to where gateball fits in CNZ was made. At this time, there are not enough resources to support it but the Executive will continue to be open to including it.
- 6. There is an anomaly between CNZ and WCF youth age. The Executive will discuss it.

Meeting was closed and 4 workshops were held over Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning.

<u>Proposed Changes to the CNZ Constitution</u>: The first workshop was on the proposed changes to the Constitution. Changes that were agreed by all delegates will be progressed next AGM or at a Special AGM. If a Special AGM is held, delegates will vote by email. Because there has been a rich discussion at the AGM, an email vote was considered feasible. The changes that needed more work will be reworked or dropped.

<u>Vetting at Club Levels</u>: Greg Bryant, SDO, presented information about vetting for "vulnerable persons" that includes youth and others who are vulnerable. For more information, please contact Greg.

<u>Insurance Scheme</u>: CNZ offers insurance for all clubs and associations. Approximately a third of the clubs have taken up the scheme through CNZ. Jake Inwood, Executive Director (ED), is investigating lower costs for clubs and associations. He noted that if more clubs and associations joined, then it would lower the annual cost. For more information, please contact Jake at CNZ. <u>Please note that Jake has investigated the option and no changes can be made this year.</u>

<u>Health & Safety:</u> Jake Inwood, ED, outlined the new health and safety regulations and the possible impact on clubs and associations. The Executive is in the process of accepting a Health and Safety Policy and manual that is available to all clubs and associations. For more information, please contact Jake at CNZ.

Greg comes from Westport on the southern west coast of New Zealand, from where he leads a very unbalanced croquet orientated lifestyle. He has represented NZ in numerous world championship events, the first at Newport in 1992. Greg is a 4 time winner of the NZ Open, NZ Invitation and NZ Men's events and was a member of the winning NZ MacRobertson Shield team in 2014. Greg is employed by Croquet NZ as the organization's Sport Development Officer.

Paddy Chapman



Paddy was born in 1987 in Christchurch, New Zealand, and moved to Nottingham, UK, in 2010 where he works in IT as a DBA for Walgreens Boots Alliance. He started playing croquet at the age of 11, and was mentored by the legendary John Prince. He is married to Miranda (also a croquet player) and they have two kids - Ollie and Matilda. He is very much looking forward to being back in NZ and playing in his 6th World Championship.

Titles he has won over the years include the NZ Open Championship, Australian Men's Championship, Australian Open Doubles (with Greg

Bryant and Miranda Chapman respectively), British Open Doubles (with Dave Maugham) and UK President's Cup. He has also been a finalist in both the British Open and World Championship singles. He was a member of the winning NZ MacRobertson Shield team in 2014 and has played in 4 MacRobertson Shields for NZ (one in each country).

Jenny Clarke



Jenny is a senior lecturer in sport science and coordinator of a sport coaching degree programme at the University of Canterbury.

Since discovering croquet at Oxford University in 1999, Jenny has won both Association and Golf croquet events worldwide. Along with husband Chris, Jenny was the first person to win both the Association and Golf croquet world team championship titles (MacRobertson Shield and Openshaw Shield), and in 2017 she had the honour of captaining the New Zealand MacRobertson Shield team in California. A regular at the Australian AC Open, and current British Women's and Mixed Doubles champion (with Chris), Jenny is looking to improve on quarter final placings in the previous two AC world singles events.

In addition to playing croquet competitively, Jenny also enjoys

coaching, particularly combining modern theories on athlete-centred approaches from University with coaching croquet at all levels.

In recent years Jenny has become a very keen golfer, which has provided a welcome balance to many years of high concentration on croquet. Other interests include travel, gardening and spending time with Chris and their two very bouncy dogs.
