From the President

Congratulations also in order to the newly elected officers of Auckland Croquet Association. I was pleased to be invited by **Maida Beetson**, President of Auckland Croquet Association, and attend their AGM. One of the exciting parts was the addition of a new position: Coordinator for Croquet in Schools. The role was introduced, a motion was carried, and **Kathie Grant** from Epsom Remuera Croquet Club was named during the General Business.

Regions that involve youth in croquet have found it to be extremely rewarding in both the positive energy the youth bring to the game and to the club. It takes a dedicated person to pursue and convince Sports Directors of the schools to add another sport to the 42 they currently coordinate. It is a tough job to encourage schools to give croquet a go and Kathie is the best person to make it happen in Auckland's region. CNZ fully supports the efforts of clubs and regions in developing a youth programme.

Auckland Croquet Association asked me to speak about Croquet in Schools, which was a timely topic. The Youth Development programme was started by **Greg Bryant**, CNZ's Sport Development Officer. Greg has been a powerful force behind this initiative and the results tell the story.

More specifically I talked about the Croquet In Schools programme that I've been involved in my region. Hearing stories about what others have found to be successful and why are important because the stories share the richness of the experience, the passion of the people involved and the excitement of the results of having youth start to play croquet. I would encourage associations in your area to contact other regions to talk about what worked well and why. We can leave a powerful legacy for future generations by creating a youth development programme. If you haven't started one I encourage you to do so.

The second area I addressed was the vision, mission and strategic goals that CNZ is currently drafting. CNZ's focus will be in four areas: increase participation, excel in croquet, develop best governance practices, and ensure financial sustainability. At the AGM in October these areas will be part of the discussion.

Thank you Auckland Croquet Association for inviting me to your meeting. I look forward to visiting other associations.

Sport Development By Greg Bryant

CNZ SECONDARY SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

The CNZ Tournament Committee recently announced date changes to the National Secondary Schools Finals and Regional qualifying competitions.

From 2017, croquet associations and RST's will be encouraged to hold their regional school age GC championships during NZSSSC Tournament Week (week starting Monday 27 March 2017). Qualifying teams can then contest the National Secondary Schools Championship which will be held in late September each year, after winter sports tournament week and before the end of term 3 – the next being 23 & 24 September 2017.

For most, the initiative provides several advantages over the current programme;

- Croquet is presented as a genuine sport option alongside mainstream sports in schools through the inclusion of regional championships during tournament week.
 Communitications with school coordinators is simplified and more effective.
- Regional qualifiers and the National Finals will both be held in the same school year.
- The window of time for the delivery of CNZ Intro-Croquet sessions is extended and the focus on regional participation and competition enhanced.
- Lead-in time for regional qualifiers attending the National Finals event is also extended by 5 to 6 months (as opposed to 1 to 2 months for new regions hosting CNZ Intro-Croquet sessions) allowing time for fundraising and potentially a reduction of costs. Several schools contribute to their student's attendence but face budget constraints.
- Lead-in time for CNZ youth development squad invitations is reduced, and will now occur in the same croquet season. This facilitates the transition from school participation to youth club memberships early in the season.

- Supports the NZ Under 21 Championship held 10-12 weeks after the National Secondary Schools event. The CNZ Under 21 Champs (termed 'the undies' by the kids) now includes a doubles title as well.
- The season-to-season link for student participation is strengthened with the National Finals event now being in the same calendar year but in the next croquet season.
- School age regional competitions can be held on a school day! No need to compete for valuable weekend dates.
- With more consistent regional timing, CNZ is able to promote regional participation to more RST's more effectively.

What happens next?

- Determine a suitable date and venue for your Regional Secondary Schools Championship, preferably during tournament week Monday 27 to Friday 31 March 2017.
- Contact the secondary school sports coordinator at your Regional Sports Trust to confirm your dates. Sanctioning of regional school competitions with your RST for 2017 will be due in about September each year.

PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENTS TAKING TO MALLETS



Some regions are experiencing an increase of year 7 & 8 (Intermediate) students wanting to play croquet and participate in local competitions. This is being encouraged by a number of Regional Sport Directors and it has also been noted in club and association responses to the CNZ review of the Secondary Schools Programme. At least three associations included a Primary Division in their regional competition last season.

While year 7 & 8 students are not eligible to participate in the NZSSSC sanctioned National Secondary Schools competition, inclusion of a Primary Division is encouraged. If you don't currently have a Regional Secondary Schools competition, contact Greg Bryant to discuss CNZ support to establish regional youth participation in croquet

Shot of the day was a long hoop jump by Cameron Brewster having learnt to jump only a week earlier. Jakob Holm Tara HS, earned 19 points to come 3 rd overall and 2 nd in the Secondary event. Claudia Anderson of Napier GHS, another new player, was 3 rd in the Secondary School event with 15pts, 5 th= overall, and Sarah Forster, also NGHS 4 th SS and 7 th= overall, 10pts. The Intermediate grade runner up was Josh Douglas, 18pts, after some very determined challenges from Georgia Anderson, Tam Int, 15pts, and Cameron Brewster Tama Int 4 th 12pts. Georgia Anderson, Tam Int was 5 th = overall and Cameron Brewster Tam Int 6th. The next Interschool Tournament will be held Sept 25 th at Marewa Croquet Club. The players went home at the end of the day with certificates in hand and smiles on their faces.

With almost a hundred years of history behind it Matamata Croquet Club Inc., is making a huge change.

At an August 21 2015 special general meeting of the club, the membership agreed to the idea of moving the grounds to another venue. After many discussions with Matamata/Piako District Council an agreement was struck and the offer of grounds at Pohlen Park was taken up. With the Peria Rd property sold, this allows the club to build six international sized greens, a new club house and storage shed at the new venue.

Work has already begun on the project with 40 square metres of a special soil mix being spread and the ground over and under sown.

The time frame for opening is around Labour Week-End 2016 and the invitations to the opening will be going out
