# Number of games per day – the following feedback was received.

- Maybe could've done an extra round on one of the days because we were usually finished around 2:30 3:00pm
- potentially min of 6 and max of 9 is a good range
- 9 games a day is fine for youngsters, not so fine for older folk.

#### **CNZ TC Response**

CNZ policy is to try and provide players with a *minimum* of 6 games or 2 matches. The current format achieves this by providing 6-9 games / 3 matches.

## Lawns – the following feedback was received

- Very straight, nice lawns
- As good as could be expected considering the dry summer
- bit patchy
- Three were ok but one was substandard bare area plus a big fall over on one part of the lawn.
- The club made huge efforts to get them to this condition, I know because I played there only a month back and they were not nearly that good.

#### **CNZ TC Response**

#### **CNZ TC Response**
