Response to feedback

Format - the following feedback was received

- There is excellent competition available and it allows 'lesser' player an opportunity to play against 'top players'
- · It flowed well
- Excellent format which made qualifying from the blocks a challenge.
- I liked the block system.
- Geoff Young could do this in his sleep, brilliant!

CNZ TC Response

It's great to have such positive feedback on the format and it sounds as though everyone had an enjoyable tournament.

Number of games per day – the following feedback was received.

- There were enough games to test fitness and not too many to cause time problems
- Five block games followed by one Bo3 was a reasonably long day, finishing about 6pm. It appeared as if most of the players were able to cope with the work load.
- Never more than 7

CNZ TC Response

CNZ policy is to try and ensure 6+ games of GC per day and it looks like this was easily achieved.

Lawns - the following feedback was received

- The greens ran fast (10/11 on the Stimp) which was excellent. The surfaces were patchy and the levels left a lot to be desired.
- There is a down hill run on all lawns which makes ball placement hard
- · Apart from a few areas where the balls deviated the lawns were well dressed
- It was the first time I have played on the new lawns, they were not flat or true, but were a test for all players. Lawns would be a test if playing AC in February running at 12+ seconds.
- Very good surface such a shame that they are on a slope
- The balls curve too much away from the clubhouse
- Lawns had good speed, nice and fast, however balls do tend to curve around when played softly
- Fast (considering the weather), 3mm mowing before and during tournament, firm hoops. Lawns are not flat, but the bias added interest.
- Lawn surface was good but lawns were not flat and had all sorts of hills and run-offs to trap the unwary.
- The balls curved too much on most lawns at times it seemed farcical

CNZ TC Response

Thanks go to Matamata club for providing such good quality lawns so early in the playing season. CNZ appreciates that the Matamata lawns are very new, and hope that over a period of years, the general slopes can be lessened by annual top-dressing
