November has been a busy month with the first CNZ Tournaments of the year going ahead.

The North and South Island GC Championships were played at Waikanae Croquet Club (Wellington) and Aorangi Croquet Club (South Canterbury) respectively from 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> November 2020.

The North Island GC saw Paul Kaiser (Manawatu-Wanganui) secure both the Open Singles and the Open Doubles with his partner, Dennis Bulloch (Manawatu-Wanganui).

Down south, Logan McCorkindale defended his South Island GC title going through the event undefeated. While Graeme Simpson (Canterbury) and Suzanne Cleveland (South Canterbury) won the doubles.

## Club News

The rise and rise of Golf Croquet Rod Templeman

Some interesting statistics from the World Croquet Federation database suggest that the popularity of Golf Croquet in NZ is mirrored elsewhere in the world. In the 5 years from 2015 to 2019 the number of GC tournaments played has increased by 51%, and tournament participation is up by 41.9%. Sadly, that's not so with AC; in that same period the number of AC tournaments declined by 3.6% and participation therein declined 2.6%.

These past 12 months I have been made aware of disquiet amongst GC players, who suggest that 'their game' doesn't get the attention from CNZ that it deserves. They argue that with only 20% of members listed in the current Year Book having an AC handicap, GC should receive 80% of the focus, particularly since annual GC membership in NZ is increasing at 5%, whereas AC is declining at 10%. I'd like to reassure GC players that CNZ is fully aware of their concern, and that moves are afoot to address the apparent imbalance.

Change will not happen overnight, after all AC was played in 1900 at the Summer Olympics in Paris, whereas the first World GC Tournament only took place in 1996. However, the CNZ Tournament Committee is Chaired by Sonia Sedgwick, one of NZ's Croquet Matters - November 2020 top 5 women GC players, and Gretchen Benvie has already joined the CNZ Laws Committee. Meanwhile CNZ seek GC players to join both the Tournament Committee, and a new Handicap Committee; please contact your regional Association if you are interested to serve.

Having watched NZ's young team convincingly win the World GC event, Croquet Auckland decided to actively promote the game for older players. They revamped the outdated GC 'Northern Vets' and, having obtained sponsorship from Ryman Healthcare, renamed it 'The Ryman Golden Grades', taking entries only from those over 65, and playing it on 8 lawns over 3 days (thanks to both hosts, North Shore and Takapuna Croquet Clubs). There were 72 entries, with waiting lists for two of the 4 Grades, and the event was very well managed by Anne Mortimer and Melba Scott.
