
Over 50s WC Changes to Over 60s

Rule of the Month

5.1.1 Order of Play

"The sides are to decide the order of play by tossing a coin or by an equivalent procedure. The winning side decides whether to play first or second."

This new rule from the GC Rules 6th Edition applies to the start of a match and is a change from the 5th Edition in which the winning side of the coin toss would always play the first stroke.

Now, the winner of the coin toss is permitted to choose colours and hence whether to play first or second.

Please be aware of Rule 5.3, which applies to matches of more than one game, and how starting subsequent games works in these cases.
