## **World Croquet Federation**

#### **AC & GC Rankings**

The latest Country Rankings were released by the WCF on 31 March.

In AC, New Zealand remains in 3<sup>rd</sup> place, but has closed the gap to Australia in 2<sup>nd</sup> from 24 points at the start of the year to just 11 points.

In GC, Egypt, England and the USA remain at the top with New Zealand in 4<sup>th</sup>, 14 points behind 3<sup>rd</sup>.

### New Plymouth CC Centenary

This was the 100<sup>th</sup> season of croquet on the Te Henui Reserve in New Plymouth.

In late 1922, the pavilion and the flagpole were erected. On 27 March 1923, a whirlwind "tore off the veranda, snapped the flagpole and injured the rest of the building putting the club to the expense of £10 for the repair costs". Membership in 1922-23 was 39 playing members and 25 honorary members.

New Plymouth CC currently has 76 members., and looks forward to the next century.
