Women's GC World Championship



Jessica Bullen (Wellington) brought home her first piece of international silverware after winning the Plate Final of the Women's GC World Championship.

The Championship was won by Australia's Jamie Gumbrell, who beat Rachel Gee of England.

Jenny Clarke (Canterbury) made it through to the Championship quarterfinals. Dallas Cooke, Ashley Cooke (both Bay of Plenty) and Helen Reeves (Hawkes Bay) all made it through to the knockout stages and then through to the Bowl. Ashley Cooke lost to eventual winner Judith Hanekom in the last 16, while Dallas & Helen faced each other in the quarterfinal.

Congratulations again to Jessica for flying the flag high for New Zealand as the tournament's youngest competitor.

AC World Championship

This year's World Championship was won by England's Robert Fulford, who beat GC World Champion Matthew Essick in an epic 5 match final. This was Fulford's 6th AC World Championship. You can read a play by play of the final <u>here</u>.

NZ's Logan McCorkindale (South Canterbury) made it furthest out of our representatives, through to the quarterfinals where he lost to champion Robert Fulford.

Jenny Clarke made the Plate semi-finals after winning 5 matches in her Block and just missing out on the Championship knockouts. Peter Filbee (South Taranaki) and Dennis Bulloch (Manawatu-Wanganui) both won 4 matches in their Blocks.

GC Over 50s Championship

Six New Zealanders will compete in the GC Over 50s Championship in Bunbury, Western Australia from 14-21 October.

Ricky Clement (South Taranaki) has been awarded a replacement ranking place and joins Jenny Clarke, Brian Bullen (Wellington), John Christie (Thames Valley), Helen Reeves and Nelson Morrow (Auckland) for the final playing of the tournament before it becomes eligible for over 60s only.
