Our first tournament will be held on 2/3 September at the Epsom Remuera CC with the Secondary Schools National Final returning after four years.

There have also been some changes to our committees with both Tony Stephens and Mike Crashley retiring from the GC Selection Committee after more than 10 years of dedicated service. Helen Reeves has joint the GC Selection Committee with another committee member still to be appointed.

Thank you to all the association coordinators and the club officials involved.

CNZ will hold its Annual General Meeting in Wellington on 5 October 2024, following by our Annual CNZ Awards Presentation, recognising our outstanding clubs, volunteers and players.



2024 GC World Championship

Edmund Fordyce, Felix Webby, Jenny Clarke, Nathan Bullen and Te Kiri King will be representing New Zealand in Chesapeake Bay, Virginia, USA for the 15th edition of the GC World Championship.

They will be looking to become the first New Zealanders to win the event after Josh Freeth and Felix were bronze medallists in 2019 and 2017 respectively.

2025 Openshaw Shield

The GC World Teams Tier 1 Event will be held in Tasmania from 17-23 February 2025.

Players currently in the wider squad are: Jenny Clarke, Edmund Fordyce, Levi Franks, Josh Freeth, Te Kiri King, Logan McCorkindale, Felix Webby and Josh Winter.

The team of four players looking to defend the title for a second time will be finalised at the end of October.
