Referee in Charge

To provide clarity on when a Referee in Charge can be appointed the CNZ Laws Committee have proposed and the CNZ Board have approved a new Referee Regulation. Link to the new regulation can be found <u>here</u>.

GC Umpire Qualification

With the GC Rules becoming more comprehensive and complex over the years the CNZ Laws Committee has considered the introduction of a new GC Umpire Qualification. The new qualification, which will focus on some key GC Rules rather than all the Rules, was proposed to the Board and was approved at the December Board meeting. The Laws Committee will now work on finalising the training and exam material for this new qualification before its launch next year. This new qualification will hopefully introduce a wider group of our members to laws qualifications and help counter the decline in number of qualifications.
