GC Open Championships

The GC Open championships were held in Nelson from 6-11 January. **Logan McCorkindale** (Canterbury) winning the Singles. **Josh Winter**

(Canterbury) won the Bowl section, Angus Coulter the Shield, and the Singles Plate was wan by Paul Kaiser (Canterbury). Logan & Reece McCorkindale (Canterbury) won the GC Open Doubles while the Doubles Plate was won by Angus Coulter (Bay of Plenty) & Josh Freeth (Auckland).

AC Open Championships

The AC Open Championships were held in Bay of Plenty from 18-25 January and saw Jenny Clarke (Canterbury) win the AC Open Singles, while Paddy Chapman (Thames Valley) & Logan McCorkindale (Canterbury) won the AC Open Doubles.



Jenny Clarke is the first woman to win the NZ Open Singles title in 59 years with the great Jean Jarden being the last female winner in January 1966 in Wanganui.

World Croquet Federation

WCF GC World Team Championship

The so called Openshaw Shield was held in Launceston, Tasmania on 17-23 February 2025. New Zealand were the defending champions, having won the last two editions, but were unable to make it three in a row. Our team lost 9:4 to the USA in the semifinal, while the USA went on to win the final 7:0 and taking the Openshaw Shield home for the first time. A milestone for American croquet, with the USA securing its first-ever World Teams Championship in either GC or AC. Congratulations USA!

Under 21 GC World Championship

The next World Championship event will be held in Florida, USA between 14-18 April 2025, being the Under 21 GC World Championship. As previously announced CNZ will be sending 5 players, including Openshaw team member Levi Franks (Canterbury).

The other players are Jessica Bullen (Wellington,) Callum McKinnon (Wellington), Luke Francis (Manawatu-Wanganui) and Mattie Clarkson (Counties Manukau).
