Chief Executive

Welcome to our latest newsletter and to the start of another season of great croquet!

Our Tournament Committee and team have been working very hard to get everything ready for the new season. The tournament calendar and registrations are available online on our website. Our first tournaments will be the Secondary Schools competitions which have been split into two events with one to be held on each island.

Approximately 18 months ago we started our journey to get our clubs, associations and ultimately CNZ reregistered under the Incorporated Societies Act 2022.

With almost all clubs reregistered, most associations having completed the process as well we are now looking at adopting a new constitution for CNZ to complete the process.

CNZ has prepared comprehensive templates and guidance notes for clubs and associations to use, that provide a clear link across all levels of our organisation. While the vast majority has followed the templates there are a few exceptions and these clubs will need to bring their constitutions in line with our template and CNZ will work with associations to complete that process over the coming months.

The new CNZ constitution is expected to be adopted at our Annual General Meeting. The new constitution has undergone consultation of members which has been overall very positive and supportive. The new constitution will provide our associations with a greater opportunity to participate and influence the board and ultimately shape CNZ. With that opportunity comes a responsibility for associations to become more active and embrace that opportunity.

The CNZ Annual General Meeting will be held in Wellington on 4 October 2025, followed by our Annual CNZ Awards Presentation, recognising our outstanding clubs, volunteers and players.


CNZ is expected to be livestreaming the event via Whakaata Māori. Check our Facebook page before the event to find the link.
