World Croquet Federation

2025 WCF Association Croquet World Championship

The World Championship in Association Croquet was held in Florida from 18 to 26 October. New Zealand was represented by six players with Jenny Clarke, brothers Logan & Reece McCorkindale (all Canterbury), Jarrod Coutts (South Canterbury) and Edmund Fordyce (Thames Valley) qualifying for the knockout phase, while John Versey (Central Districts) continued in the Plate Event after the Block phase. Reece McCorkindale had to earn his spot in the World Championship through the qualifying tournament and followed it up with impressive performances in the Block phase to reach the knockout.

Edmund Fordyce lost in the first round of the knockout however, then went on to reach the final of the Bowl Event, where he lost to veteran and former AC World Champion Stephen Mulliner of England. Jenny Clarke reached the semifinal of the Bowl Event.

Logan McCorkindale started the knockout stage with a comfortable win in two games over Coutts followed by convincing wins in straight games against Alain Giraud of England and Ben Rothman of the USA to reach the semifinal. Unfortunately, the semifinal opponent Reg Bamford of South Africa proved too strong and Logan lost the semifinal three games to nil. Bamford went on to win his sixth AC World Championship title!

Well done to the entire team and congratulations to Logan for winning the Bronze Medal and to Reg Bamford for his World Championship title.

Cancer Awareness

September and October are two months during which awareness for two common cancers affecting a large number of people, including our members, every year. September was Blue September raising awareness of prostate cancer, while October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

A message from Prostate Cancer Foundation NZ

Regular prostate checks—including an annual PSA blood test—are crucial for men in their 40s-60s, as early detection dramatically improves the chances of curative treatment and can prevent premature death from prostate cancer, which accounts for over 4,000 NZ cases and 700 deaths each year. Because prostate cancer often develops silently, routine screening helps identify elevated PSA levels that warrant further investigation before the disease spreads beyond the prostate, where treatment options become limited. October – Breast Cancer Awareness month!

Regular breast cancer screenings—such as mammograms and clinical exams—are essential for women, especially those over 40, because early detection greatly increases the likelihood of successful treatment and reduces mortality. Breast cancer remains one of the most common cancers worldwide. Since many tumours develop without obvious symptoms, women are encouraged to schedule yearly check-ups, stay informed and seek <u>resources</u> from organisations like <u>Breast Cancer Foundation NZ</u>.
