Central A – Ian Parker (Bay of Plenty)

South A – Peter Burt (Marlborough Nelson West Coast)

South B – John Borner (Canterbury)

The new Board took authority at the beginning of December and is responsible for shaping the next phase of CNZ's development and growth.

The election left a vacancy in Electoral District Central, which the new Board filled by appointing outgoing Board Member Graeme Roberts (Wellington) to the Board.
